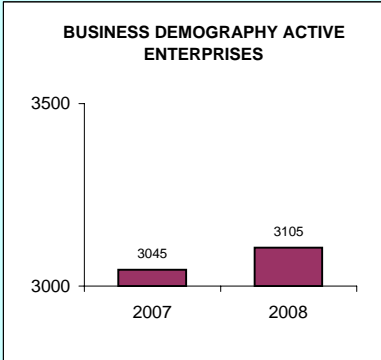

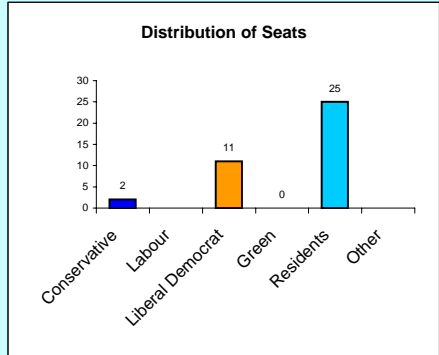

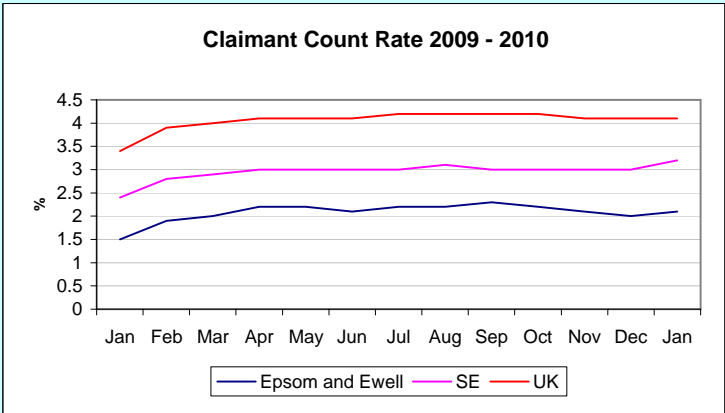


Political Make - Up (as at 02/05/08)

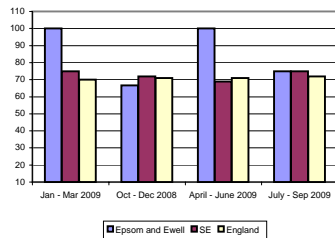

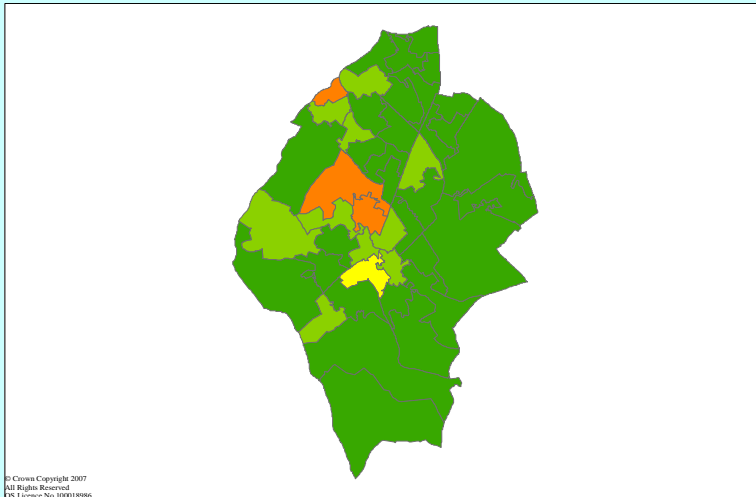
